Is this our Church?! Yes!

Pope Francis recalls that St. Benedict urged his abbots to consult the young “before any important decisions are made because ‘the Lord often reveals to the younger what is best.’ (Rule of St. Benedict, III, 3).”

That is how Francis closed a letter he wrote to the young (aged 16-29) earlier this year. The topic? The October 2018 Synod of Bishops will focus on the young, entitled, "Young People, Faith, and Vocational Discernment."

Right now he is asking the young to help him and his brother bishops to prepare for the synod by voicing “your sensitivities and your faith; even your doubts and your criticism” to the Church. To do this, he invites the young to read a preparatory document found here [http://www.vatican.va/roman\\_curia/synod/documents/rc\\_synod\\_doc\\_20170113\\_documento-preparatorio-xv\\_en.html](http://www.vatican.va/roman_curia/synod/documents/rc_synod_doc_20170113_documento-preparatorio-xv_en.html) and then complete an online questionnaire, available at this address: <https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/TXNSXP5> (Your responses must be made prior to 7/24/17).

Our Pope recognizes that in today’s culture there is “abuse of power, injustice and war.” That many people experience the threat of violence and may be forced to flee all that has been familiar. To the young and all of us, Francis asks us to block out the noise and confusion of our culture and look to Jesus, our Savior. Do we see Him in all that we observe? Do we hear His call? Do we pay attention to the urgings He places upon our spirits?

He affirms the young (and all of us) by urging us to discern God’s plan for our lives through prayer, service and spiritual coaching. When we open our hearts to Jesus’ call, and embrace it with joy and courage, “God, rich in mercy, will extend His hand to pick you up” when we fall or the journey becomes uncertain.

Francis reminds us of God’s words to Abraham, “Go from your country and your kindred and your father’s house to the land that I will show you.” (Gen 12.1). Will that land be a more just and friendly society built by the young? That is the hope that Francis felt at the last World Youth Day (Krakow, Poland 8/2016). Francis urged the young to “Listen to the cry arising from your inner selves! Even when you feel like the prophet Jeremiah, the inexperienced youth, go where God sends you: “Do not be afraid, [...], because I am with you to deliver you” (Jer 1:8).”

The Pope ended his letter by writing, “My brother bishops and I want even more to “work with you for your joy” (2 Cor 1:24). I entrust you to Mary of Nazareth, a young person like yourselves, whom God beheld lovingly, so she might take your hand and guide you to the joy of fully and generously responding to God’s call with the words: “Here I am” (cf. Lk 1:38). *Patty*




**Summer Day of Prayer**
